

"But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. If all were a single member, where would the body be? As it is, there are many members, yet one body."

(1 Corinthians 12:18-20)

"I love Jesus but really don't like the church." Ever heard someone say that? (Or perhaps you've said it yourself). You're not alone. Many have been injured in some fashion in a church setting, whether by a church leader or by others in the congregation, and struggle with how to reconcile their affection for Christ with the real issues they have with the church – that is, the members of the church.

Others are just simply frustrated at how congregations can get so worked up about things like the style of music or the color of the carpet while neglecting to "do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly" with God. In any event, being an active part of a church ranks fairly low on the priority list for most folks.

As a result, many have convinced themselves that they can be authentic followers of Jesus without being active members of a local church. What we have to remember, however, is that Jesus died not just for individuals, but for the church, his body. Giving instructions to married men, Paul writes "Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her..." (Ephesians 5:25).

We should also remember the words of Jesus himself, when he confronted Paul (Saul) on the road to Damascus. Saul had been persecuting the followers of Jesus – the church – and Jesus said to him, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?" (Acts 9:4) Jesus fully identifies with the church, which Scripture describes as his bride. To disparage the church is to disparage Jesus himself.

We all know the church is imperfect, and will remain so until the Lord returns. But we also must make our church family a priority, because it's a priority for the Lord himself. Each part of the body is necessary and valued, and has a part to play in the Lord's work in this world. Pray that the Lord would give you a renewed heart for the church, and show you how your gifts and talents fit together with others to build one another up, and share the good news of Jesus with the world.

GAP Ministries Food Drive


9/18/2021 from noon to 3 PM
